Application Qualifications and Instructions

To qualify for this Scholarship Program, the applicant must...

- currently be a resident of Sonoma or Marin County or a member of St. Helena FFA (part of the Sonoma FFA Section)
- have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.50
- be no older than 23 years of age
- **must be a current member of Sonoma County Grange Credit Union**
- currently be attending or going to attend any post high school accredited university, college or education system with an emphasis in the area of **agriculture**

When submitting your application, the applicant must...

- ✓ provide a completed application
- ✓ provide **two** letters of recommendation referencing the applicant's character, responsibility, citizenship, and financial need.
- ✓ provide an **OFFICIAL** copy of school transcript (online printouts will not be accepted!)

All of these materials should be submitted at the same time!

Top applicants must attend an interview to be scheduled in April;
applicants will be contacted with time and date.

Applications, letters of recommendation and official transcripts must be received on or before 4:00 PM, Friday, April 13, 2012!
